Notions: 100% cotton thread, size 75/11 quilting needles, chalk wheel or air-or water-soluble fabric marking pen, point presser/clapper, point turner, sleeve board (optional), silk organza press cloth, tape measure, seam gauge, tailor's ham, 1/4" Steam-a-Seam 2.

Optional: "Design Options" on page 7 of instructions include 1 to 4 buttons. Serger recommended for both views.

Fabrics: Handkerchief linen to medium weight linen, linen blends, blouse weight cotton, cLight to medium-weight linen, linen blends, medium-weight cotton, cotton blends, pique, chambray, light-weight denim, tencel, silk matka, silk shantung, dupionni, tissue weight wool, wool crepe. JACKET: Silk organza. Jacket not suitable for diagonals or plaids. Allow extra fabric for matching stripes.

Jacket: high-hip flared jacket, loose swing fit. Asymmetrical hems with front and back flanges. Drop shoulders, patch pocket. Left and right fronts are different widths to create softly draped lapels. Accent edgestitching and topstitching. Bracelet-length sleeves. Interesting collar ending at the front edge line of the garment creates a double collar effect but with one continuous collar piece.

**Shell:** Asymmetrical neckline and fronts; multi-level hem. Sleeveless shell completely machine stitched. Bias armhole bindings or optional single fold bias tape. Mitered hem corners. Optional vest ideas.
